By signing below, I agree to obey the following set of rules.

- 1. Respect the authority of the directors. The directors have a big job to maintain order and safety for all participants. We will do our best to maintain a fun environment while keeping order and education at the forefront.
- 2. Respect fellow participants and their property. Stealing, gossiping, fighting, and other such problematic behavior causes distrust in an atmosphere intended to foster trust. Please keep the Golden Rule in mind. It is also highly encouraged that participants bring only needed items to the theater. This minimizes the possibility of lost and stolen items.

- 4. Always participate to the fullest. All activities are meant to foster the craft of theater. Unless there is a physical reason why participants can't join in an activity, they are expected to give full effort. Failure to do so will be dealt with at the director's discretion.
